

## SUMMARY

**Subject of the thesis:** The USA and Israel: the dynamics and development prospects of strategic partnership.

**Relevance of research:** since the end of the 1990s in the international documents, scientific literature, public rhetoric and the media the term «strategic partnership» has become increasingly used, now firmly included in the conceptual framework of international cooperation. It has become very actively used by political scientists, diplomats and journalists as a characteristic of a particular way of international relations.

Despite the fact that the term «strategic partnership» had been used regularly and recently there has been a growing number of strategic partnerships among international actors, the term is not well studied in both foreign and Russian political science. It is relevant to determine the meaning of the phenomenon of international relations, and then use it to interpret the relations between the U.S. and Israel at the present stage.

Today we can observe the transformation of the political environment in the Middle East, and thereby changing the strategic partnership between the U.S. and Israel and the strategic objectives of the partnership. Cooperation between the two countries faces challenges that can make a split in their partnership or strengthen it and move it to a new level. Therefore, at this stage it is important to analyze the various aspects of the strategic partnership between the two countries, the dynamics of their development, as well as challenges, the solution of which can be the key element to further strengthen the partnership between the U.S. and Israel.

**The purpose** of the work is to identify the level of strategic partnership between the United States and Israel at the present stage, as well as prospects for the development of this partnership.

**Research objectives:**

- explore strategic partnerships as a category in the international political system;
- review factors to consider forming a strategic partnership;
- explore US-Israeli ideological and political cooperation;
- analyze military-technical, economic and scientific cooperation between the U.S. and Israel.

**Scientific novelty:** was given the scientific interpretation of the term "strategic partnership" with regard to international relations, as well as analyzed the strategic partnership between the United States and Israel.

**Structure:** the two chapters, containing four paragraphs, the conclusion and a 86-reference bibliography (44 of which are in foreign languages) and the 1 Appendix. The total volume is 79 pages.

**Summary:** in terms of globalization world process when international relations are complex and uncertain, states enter into such forms of relationship as a strategic partnership, which is a long-term mutually beneficial cooperation of equal actors at the international level in several basic areas in order to solve common problems of a strategic nature.

The strategic partnership between the U.S. and Israel develops asymmetrically. Politically, there have been inconsistencies that slow the process of developing a strategic partnership. The United States and Israel continue to share a common task of preserving security, despite this, the close cooperation between the countries in the military sphere leads to a strong dependence of Israel, which negatively affects both the political and the economic spheres of the country. In the economic and scientific-technical aspect traced effective mutually beneficial cooperation in the framework of the strategic partnership.

The strategic partnership between the U.S. and Israel is in the interest of both countries and at the moment at a high level of development, but there are undergoing serious difficulties and misunderstandings that need to be carefully addressed in order to further build a profitable strong strategic partnership between the two countries.
